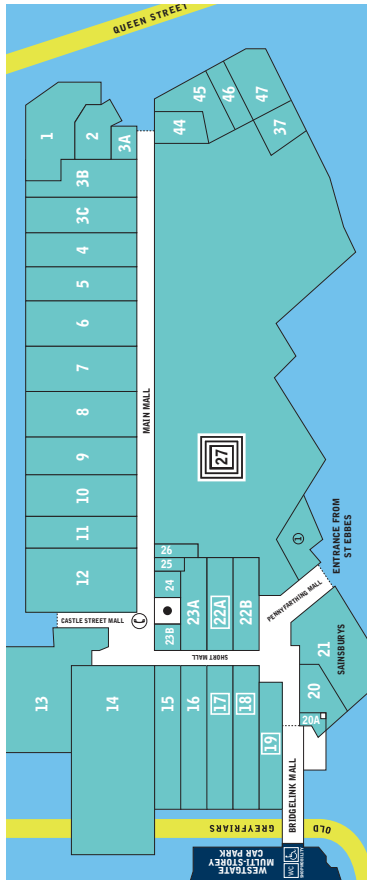

By Bus

There are three main bus company's operating in Oxford, Oxford Bus Company, Stagecoach and Thames Travel. Many of the buses stop in streets adjacent to Westgate such as Queen Street, New Road and Castle Street. Park & Ride

Oxford also has an excellent Park & Ride system. There are five Park and Ride sites around the city on Oxford's ring road and all are clearly signposted. They are: Pear Tree • Water Eaton • Thornhill • Redbridge • Seacourt Parking is free for up to 72 hours.

By Train

Oxford's main line rail station is managed by First Great Western. There are frequent services to/from London Paddington and Birmingham International. The station is situated on the western side of the city centre just 10 minutes walk from Westgate Shopping Centre. There is a taxi rank immediately outside of the station and many buses also stop at the station. Please follow the link below for a map of the station and local area.

By Taxi

If you are travelling to Westgate Shopping Centre by taxi the main entrance is on Queen St. There are further entrances on Castle St and Pennyfarthing Square which is off St Ebbs St.

By Cycle

With its student population Oxford is popular with cyclists. Westgate Shopping Centre has ample cycle rack parking near the main entrance on Queen St. There are further cycle racks on Castle Street, Old Greyfriars St and in Pennyfarthing Square.

By Car

Westgate Shopping Centre is located in the very heart of the city centre. If travelling by car you may wish to use the excellent Park & Ride service (see separate section). However, if you are driving into the city centre then Westgate Multi Storey Car Park is the largest car park in Oxford with some 1200 spaces. It is connected to the Westgate Shopping Centre by a bridgelink walkway from car park level 3. The car park is owned and operated by the City Council.
